- **1. PURPOSE:** To provide the Chief of Armor an analysis of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2012 results for the Maneuver, Fires and Effects (MFE) Brigade CSM CSL list results.
- 2. Discussion:
  - a. Armor Sergeants Major and Command Sergeants Major competed for CSL positions in the following categories:
  - K02P: Combat Arms (Maneuver)-Operations. This category is composed of Brigade Combat Teams. It was open to Armor, Infantry, Field Artillery and Combat Engineer SGMs and CSMs.
    - Twenty-two BCTs were open for competition in FY 12 with the following results.

- Both selectees were of Armor (19K) background and had one combat rotation as a Battalion CSM; one is currently a BDE CSM.
- BN level CSM experience ranged from 19 to 36 months.
- Infantrymen were selected to fill 68% of the available BCTs.
- Field Artillerymen were selected to fill 14% of the available BCTs.
- Combat Engineers were selected to fill 9% of the available BCTs.
- Six Armor SGM/CSMs were selected as alternates.

- (2) K02R: Combat Arms (Maneuver)-Strategic Support: This category includes Readiness Training Brigades and was open to Armor, Infantry, Combat Engineers, Field Artillery and Air Defense Artillery CSMs.

- Armor CSMs were selected to fill 33% of the available positions.
- Five Armor CSMs were selected as alternates.
- Both CSMs were Master Gunners (one M1A1, on M2/M3)
- Both CSMs had one combat deployment as a BN/SQN SGM.
- The selected CSMs were college graduates, one BS and one MA.
- No Armor CSMs were selected as alternates.

(3) K03R: Infantry/Armor Strategic Support.

• There were two positions open for competition both positions were assigned to an Armor CSM; both CSMs were 19D background.

- Both selectees had prior experience as BDE CSMs in the Operational Force and as BDE CSMs.
- Five Armor CSMs were selected as alternates in this category.
- (4) K03T: Infantry/Armor Training: This category includes Basic Combat Training Brigades at Fort Benning and Fort Jackson, U.S. Army Drill Sergeants School, MCoE NCOA and Operations Group (NTC).
  - Six Brigades were open for competition; Armor and Infantry were each awarded three Brigades.
  - Armor CSMs were slated for two BCTB at Fort Jackson and the U.S. Army Drill Sergeants School.
  - An Infantry CSM was slated for the NTC Operations group CSM which is coded MOS 19Z in the FY 12 TDA.
  - Two Armor CSMs were selected as alternates.
- (5) K19T Armor Training: Includes Training Brigades within the U.S. Army Armor School and AC/RC BDEs.
  - Two positions were open for slating in FY 12.
  - Both CSMs had deployed as a BN/SQN CSM.
  - Both CSMs were prior Drill Sergeants; one CSM had prior experience as a BDE CSM in TRADOC.
  - Eleven CSMs were selected as alternates.
- (6) VMXF: MFE Immaterial Installation: This category includes COL level Garrison and Army Support Group Commands. Thirty-three positions were open for competition. MFE competed for eighteen positions.

- 4. Additional notes from Board AAR.
  - The Board selected 171 Brigade CSM; there are 344 Brigade level positions (including 12 ARSOF positions).
  - \* CPD results showed that, overall, 48% of the eligible population competed for CSL positions and gave preferences, 43% "opted out", while 9% took no action in the CPD. Overall, 57% (48% "yes" plus 9% "no action") of the eligible Soldiers competed for brigade and battalion positions.

\* The selection rate for Brigade 171 out of 725 (23.5%); Armor selection rate was 14 of 54 (25.9%) available positions.
