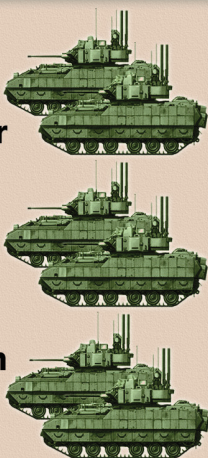
Tank Platoon

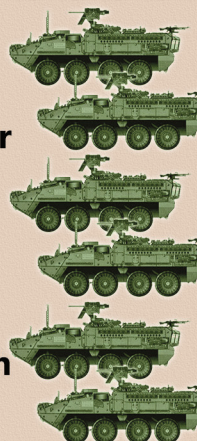

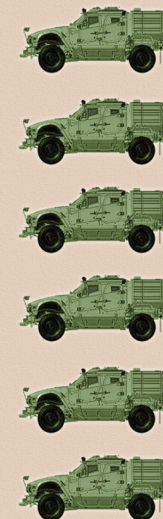

IBCT Scout Platoon

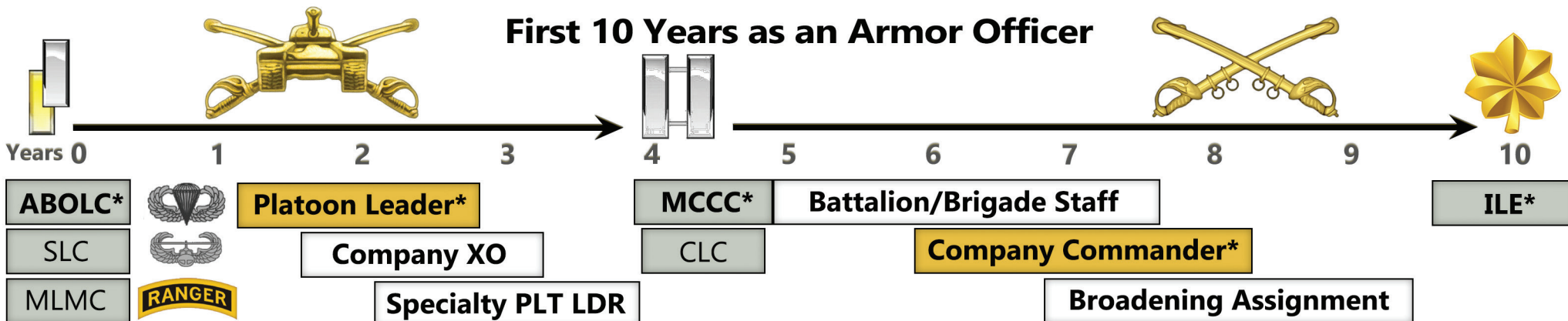
