# General Overview of Fort Benning

#### Location



Fort Benning is located in an area commonly known as the "Tri-Community", comprised of Columbus, Fort Benning, Georgia, and Phenix City, Alabama. Columbus, known as Georgia's third-largest city, is a growing community of 250,000. Besides being the home of the Best Army Installation in the World, Fort Benning, Columbus is the corporate headquarters of many leading companies such as AFLAC Insurance. Average family income is \$36,405. The stunning

# **History**

Fort Benning was established in 1918, and is named after Confederate General Henry L. Benning, who had lived in Columbus. Known as the "Home of the Infantry", the installation covers 182,000 acres. #### Mission

To provide the nation with the world's best trained Infantry Soldiers and adaptive leaders imbued with the "Warrior Ethos". To act as a power projection platform capable of deploying and redeploying Soldiers, to include Reservists and National Guard, and civilians, to anywhere in the world on short notice. To define Infantry requirements for material developers to meet the needs of the future force.

# **Population Served**

Fort Benning population has the following: Military - Active Duty 27,436; Support Reserve Components 6,639; and Retired 13,248. Dependents - On-Post Active Duty 7,268; Off-Post Active Duty 14,146; and Off-Post Retired 30,478. Civilian Employees - DoD Appropriated 3,250; Non-appropriated, AAFES, Contract, and other 5,162. Total Fort Benning Population is 107,627.

# **Base Transportation**

The Fort Benning Shuttle Bus operates Monday thru Saturday except on Federal Holidays. The Shuttle Bus stops at established Bus stops only. These stops are well marked and conveniently located throughout Fort Benning. For more information on times and locations please call 706-544-4516.

# Requesting a Sponsor

To initiate the Fort Benning Sponsorship Program it is essential that Soldiers complete the DA Form 5434 during their reassignment processing at their last duty station. The DA Form 5434 advises the command of any special needs and support mechanisms that the Total Army Sponsorship Program must muster to help the Soldier and his family. The completed DA Form 5434 should be sent to: Adjutant General/Military Personnel, Enlisted Strength Management Branch, Fort Benning, GA 31905. All military personnel are required to sign-in at Installation Replacement, Building 2607, Soldiers' Plaza, 706-545-3608/4577 for in-processing. If a DA Form 5434 is not completed, then a reactionary sponsor will be appointed after the arrival of the Soldier.

#### **Post Office Box**

If you are PCSing to Fort Benning within CONUS, Alaska or Hawaii, pick up a PS Form 1093 from your local Post Office. Complete the form and have the Clerk date stamp and initial to verify the information. Before you send it, contact the Fort Benning Post Office to request rate and availability information which are subject to change from time to time.

Currently the rates are as listed: Small Box \$20.00 for 6 months, Size 2 Box \$34.00 for 6 months. There is a choice of combination and key locks. There is a \$1 deposit per key.

# **Temporary Quarters**

Soldiers traveling on official orders (PCS/TDY) have priority and may make reservations in advance. Travelers who are not on official orders may make reservations 45 days in advance on a space available basis. Room rates range from \$34 to \$60 per night and may accommodate single and double guest rooms.



Check-in times are 2:00 - 6:00 p.m. unless reservation is guaranteed with a credit card for late arrival. After 6:00 p.m. vacant rooms are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Check-out time is 11:00 a.m. Continental breakfast provided. Requests for reservations and further assistance can be made by telephone at 706-689-0067 ext. 2800 or ext. 2538. Visit us in person at Olson Hall Bldg. 399on post. When making your reservations, please inform the reservation clerk if you have special needs such as cribs, etc.

#### **Relocation Assistance**

The Army Community Services (ACS) Relocation Program and Lending Closet are located in Bldg 7 at 7117 Baltzell Ave. the hours of operation are Monday through Friday from 8 am to 4:30 pm. You may call for directions or for more information at 706-545-4485. Digital Welcome Packets are available; to include maps and information for on-post and community programs/services are available. There is a dedicated Internet station for use by transitioning families.

The Relocation Readiness Program offers the Newcomers Orientation and Bus Tour twice a month at Benning Conference Center. On Post Organizations and Services are there to provide you with the most current services and programs available. Following the morning session a bus is available to tour Fort Benning and Uptown Columbus this is a great way to see various points of interest On Post and off. Lending Closet has a variety of items to lend while you wait for your household goods to arrive. #### **Critical Installation Information**

Visitor Access

Access to the installation is controlled through vehicle checkpoints. Drivers of vehicles without military stickers must stop at the visitor's center on I-185 present a valid driver's license and proof of registration or rental contract to get a temporary access pass. All vehicles will be stopped at the gates. Drivers and passengers should be prepared to present identification. Children 15 and younger are exempt.

# **Directions to Fort Benning**

Fort Benning is located in SW Georgia, in what is fondly called the Tri-Community. This consists of Fort Benning; Columbus, Georgia and Phenix City, Alabama. Alabama's capital, Montgomery, and Georgia's capital, Atlanta are both only an hour and a half away. Fort Benning is also only a few hours' drive from Florida's Gulf shores and the mountains of North Georgia.

# Check-in Procedures

# In processing Procedures



The Fort Benning in processing and Replacement Operations focuses on the installation in processing requirements and individual Soldier readiness verification. AG organizes the various installation agencies needed to welcome permanent party Soldiers and their Families to Fort Benning. Initial installation sign-in and replacement center support are operational 24 hours daily at Building 2607, 706-545-4577. Upon arrival at the Replacement Operations Center, each Soldier is asked a list of questions which will result in them receiving a "tailored" in processing checklist. This "tailored"

checklist will require them to in process only those optional agencies that are applicable to their needs. There are a total of ten (10) optional in processing agencies and twelve (12) mandatory agencies, as follows:

Mandatory: DENTAC, MEDPROS, TRICARE, OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH, PINNACLE ON-POST HOUSING, OFF-POST HOUSING, FINANCE, LOCAL HAZARDS SAFETY, TRAFFIC SAFETY (AGED 26 & YOUNGER), Army Community Service NEWCOMERS ORIENTATION, FINANCIAL READINESS TRAINING (1<sup>ST</sup> TERM SOLDIERS ON 1<sup>ST</sup> PCS) AND AG.

Optional: CHILD & YOUTH SERVICES, DEERS/ID CARD/ID TAGS, EFMP COORDINATOR, ACAP, GOVERNMENT TRAVEL CARD, SCHOOL LIAISON OFFICER, PROVOST MARSHAL, ENLISTED PROMOTIONS, AND MMRB OFFICE.

During the first full day of in processing, all soldiers attend a 4 hour session that involves briefings given by AG, DENTAC, MEDPROS, TRICARE, Occupational Health, Pinnacle (Post Housing), Off-Post Housing, and Finance. Upon completion of these sessions, Soldiers proceed to complete other in processing requirements identified on their "tailored" checklist. All in processing agencies are located in Soldier's Plaza and are within walking distance. Overall, it takes on average of 5 - 7 days to complete installation in processing.

Other in processing requirements will be conducted at the unit of assignment (i.e., Central Issue Facility, Security Clearance, etc.). In processing of Students and Trainees is coordinated by the Commander operating the course of instruction that the Soldier is attending. If you are coming to Fort Benning to attend training/Schools, please use the following link for check in and in-

processing procedures.

There are two different identification card sections servicing the Fort Benning area. The main ID card section provides service for all permanent party personnel (with the exception of Soldiers with the 3BCT, 3rd Infantry Division), Soldiers attending officer candidate school, Ranger School, airborne school, Infantry officer advanced or basic course, military retiree's, disabled veterans and all Family members. The section operates only by appointments. It is located in Building 2638 in Soldiers' Plaza and it is open Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., and closed from 11:45 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. for lunch. The section is closed on all federal and training holidays and may close without advance notice to support contingency operations.

# What to do if you Get Married Enroute

If you get married before you PCS, you must inform your Commander and follow the procedures exactly as you are given. If you do not follow proper procedures, the military will not pay for travel and housing for your spouse.

#### **Motor Vehicles**

# **Registration & Licensing Requirements**

Georgia and Alabama laws require you to have sufficient liability insurance and a valid driver's license in order to operate a vehicle. The term "vehicle" generally includes automobiles, motorcycles, vans, trailers and boats regularly parked or garaged overnight. Further, your vehicle must be properly registered. Even though you are in the Military, you may be required to register your vehicle instate and obtain an in-state license within a few months of moving. #### State Laws

You and your passengers must always wear seatbelts while driving, you will be ticketed and issued heavy fines if seatbelts are not secured. State law requires that all children under 5 years of age and 57" in height be properly restrained in child seats. Some states also require younger, smaller children to sit in the back seat.

Motorcycles and their operators are subject to special laws. If you own and operate a motorcycle, you must comply with those laws. Visit the State Department of Motor Vehicles website for more information. Many States and local jurisdictions have strict laws about the use of cell phones and other digital devices while driving.

# **Registering Vehicles on Post**

Registering your vehicle

All personnel who frequently use Fort Benning must register their motor vehicles within thirty days of arrival. Incoming military personnel will register their vehicles during in processing. If circumstances preclude immediate registration, a temporary pass may be authorized. Unregistered vehicles will not be operated, stored or parked on Fort Benning. Decals for Motorcycles, mopeds and motorbikes require successful completion of the Army approved Motorcycle Safety Course.

The Following items are required to register your vehicle on Fort Benning:

- 1. Valid Military ID Card
- 2. Valid State Drivers License
- 3. Current Registration for the Vehicle
- 4. If newly purchased, bring in bill of sale and a 30 day temporary pass will be issued until vehicle is registered with the state.
- Proof of Insurance.

Note: If vehicle is not register in the Sponsor or Spouses name a Notarized Letter pr Power of attorney is required giving permission to register that vehicle. Registration hours of operation are Monday-Friday 0830-1630 at Bldg 217 on Edwards Street.. Closed on all federal and training holidays.

Temporary Passes are issued by the Visitor Center. Open 24 hours a day. Post Decal Requirements

To receive a Fort Benning decal you must have the following items: current vehicle registration from the state in which the vehicle is registered, current driver's license, current insurance card or policy for the vehicle, DoD ID card or verification letter of employment of Fort Benning.

# Post Regulations

Speed Limit -- The Speed Limit on-post is 30 MPH unless otherwise posted. 15MPH during Physical Training, 6-7:30 am Mon-Fri (10MPH whenever passing troops).

Seat Belts -- Georgia State Laws requires the wearing of seat belts. Children under the age of four years need to be restrained with approved child restraint devices at all times when a vehicle is operated.

Georgia Laws defines DUI as 0.08% blood alcohol content (lowest in the USA). Do not operate any vehicle or machinery after drinking alcoholic beverages. Alcohol will not be consumed while on duty.

Motorcycles -- Army Motorcycle Safety Course is required for post registration. Riders must wear motorcycle helmets with fastened chin strap and shatter-resistant eye protection. Leather boots or shoes and gloves are a requirement. Long shirts and jackets with highly visible reflective vest are required.

Bicycles -- All bike riders are required to wear a helmet.

# Registering Vehicles in Georgia

Non-resident military stationed in Georgia are not required to register their vehicles in Georgia as long as the vehicle displays valid license plates from their home state.

There are two counties within Fort Benning: Chattahoochee and Muscogee. If you live in McGraw Manor or Custer Terrace you may register at the office in Uptown Columbus (Muscogee County). All other housing areas including Kelly Hill will need to register in Cusseta (Chattahoochee County).

When registering your vehicle you will need:

- a military ID
- title or manufacturer's certificate of origin
- proof vehicle is covered with GA liability insurance
- odometer reading
- date of purchase
- date of birth of the first person named on title
- tag fee of \$38 (cash or money order)

If there is more than one owner, all parties must be present, or have a power of attorney to sign title application.

For a leased vehicle, the original power of attorney from the leasing company is needed. To renew your registration you can get an ad valorem exemption tax form from the JAG office to avoid extra costs. USAREUR registrations are only valid for 30 days upon return from overseas. In the case of USAREUR registrations we issue a temporary decal that is good for 45 days.

## **Education - Local Schools**

Georgia law requires children must be 4 years old on or before 1 September to enter pre-kindergarten. For kindergarten, children must be 5 years old on or before September 1, and 6 years old on or before September 1 to enter the first grade.

# Documents Required to Register Include

A certified birth certificate; immunization records on Georgia state forms; vision; hearing; and dental screening, social security card; and the previous year report card if transferring from another school.

#### **DoD Schools**

The Fort Benning School System offers a top quality education to children of military personnel living on the installation.

There are six elementary schools and one middle school. High school students receive educational services at Chattahoochee High School. This school is located in Cusseta, GA. There are several magnet High Schools to choose from as well if students meet the criteria for entrance. Standardized test scores for Fort Benning Schools are available through the <a href="DoDEA Data Center">DoDEA Data Center</a>.

### Entrance Requirements

DoDEA has changed its Early Childhood Education programs entrance requirements for all DoD Schools for Calendar Year 2009-2010. Age requirement are:

- Sure Start and Pre-Kindergarten Programs, a child must be 4 years of age by September 1.
- Kindergarten Programs, a child must be 5 years of age by September 1.
- *First Grade*, a child must be 6 years of age by September 1. If you have any questions about exceptions, contact <u>Fort Benning Schools</u>, 706-545-7276 for additional information about Fort Benning Schools.

Army Continuing Education System Division (ACESD) of the Adjutant General The Education Center aids in the recruitment and retention of quality soldiers but also providing self-development opportunities for adult family members and Department of the Army civilians. # Education - Special Education/EIS

## Special Education and EDIS

The Department of Defense has two programs that provide services to children with developmental delays and disabilities in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA):

# **Infants and Toddlers** (birth to 3 years old)

Infants and toddlers are served through the Educational and Developmental Intervention Services (EDIS 706-545-3835) which is a military, medical program that provides early intervention services to infants and toddlers from birth until three years of age. Children needing specialized services are transitioned at three years to the school age special education program in the Department of Defense Elementary and Secondary Schools (DDESS).

# School Age (3-21 years)

Children are served by the Fort Benning Schools special education program and are provided for children age 3 through eighth grade. High School students are served in the adjoining counties. Students must meet the housing eligibility requirements for attending stateside DDESS schools and must meet the Department of Defense criteria for special education services. Special education services are provided within a variety of settings to include self-contained life skills classrooms, resource special education and speech therapy classrooms. and within the general education classrooms. Most students will attend their neighborhood school. Parents of preschoolers (ages 3 and 4 years) who are concerned about their child's development may contact the Special Education Office at 706-545-5520. Some special education services may have to be contracted out to the local school system (Muscogee County School District) due to the low number of students and the specialized services needed, e.g., visually impaired and hearing impaired. If you have a child that may require specialized services and/or equipment (for example, Braille, sign language interpreter, assistive technology), it is recommended you call the Student Services Office at 706-545-5520 to facilitate a smooth transition to the Ft. Benning Schools. If you are moving to Ft. Benning or the adjoining area, be sure to bring a copy of your child's Individualized Education Program (IEP), evaluation and eligibility reports to provide to the new school.

# **Continuing Education**

Education Center services include academic, career and financial aid counseling; Tuition Assistance (TA) for Soldiers; a testing center; computer lab with internet access.

# Colleges

<u>Chattahoochee Valley State Community College</u> -- The college offers the Associate in Science Degree in General Studies or an Associate in Arts Degree in Liberal Arts.

<u>Columbus State University</u> -- The university offers a wide variety of degree programs, from the Associates to the Masters level. In addition to these degree programs, CSU offers a continuing education program, professional curricula, and an ROTC program.

<u>Columbus Technical College</u> -- The institute offers an Associate Degree in Applied Technology, several diploma programs, and numerous technical certification courses.

<u>Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University</u> -- The University offers an Associates, two Baccalaureate, and two Masters of Science Degree programs in the following areas: Aeronautical Science, Technical Management, Professional Aeronautics, and Management of Technical Operations.

<u>Georgia Military College</u> -- The College offers Associate in Science and Associate in Applied Science degrees in the following areas: General Studies, Pre-Nursing, Criminal Justice, Behavioral Science, and Education.

<u>Troy University</u> - Fort Benning -- The University offers a variety of Associate, Baccalaureate, and Graduate Degree programs.

*Vincennes University* -- The University offers an Associate Degree in General Studies.

# **Spouse Career Advancement Initiative**

The Military Spouse Career Advancement Initiative is designed to advance military spouses into portable careers by providing them with education and training in high-growth, high-demand occupations. Career Advancement Accounts, also known as CAAs, are flexible education funding accounts to pay for expenses directly related to post-secondary education and training, including tuition, fees, books, equipment, and credentialing and licensing fees necessary for portable careers. High-growth industries include financial services, education, healthcare, information technology and construction. High-demand occupations can be found in human resources, hospitality, homeland security and business administration.

The Department of Labor (DOL) and the Department of Defense (DoD) are jointly funding this demonstration in eight states (California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Maine, North Carolina, and Washington) targeting 18 military installations. Voluntary Education Centers and One-Stop Career Centers are collaboratively providing career counseling, guidance and assessments to support military spouse career and education choices. CAAs, are self-managed accounts that must be used with approved local education and training institutions. CAA funds must be used for expenses directly related to career preparation. There is a limited amount of funds available in the CAA demonstration. The maximum amount of the CAA demonstration is \$6,000 for 24 months. # Military Spouse Career Advancement Account Program (MSCAAP)

The MSCAAP is a new financial aid program beginning April 2009. This program provides resources and assistance to spouses of active duty service members, Guard and Reserve (one year orders) supporting their pursuit of a successful, long-term, and portable career. The Military Spouse will be eligible to receive up to \$6,000 for certifications, licensures, GED, or college courses and must call the Military OneSource Center at 1-800-342-9647 and speak with a Career and Education Consultant. Company grade officers, warrant officers and most senior NCOs drawing Basic Allowance Housing (BAH) at the without dependents rate are not required to live on post.

# **Other Housing**

Rental Options -- Battle Park Homes, is a single-story apartment complex of two hundred two and three-bedroom units. It is located on Fort Benning near the intersection of Benning Boulevard and Custer Road. It is open to permanently assigned enlisted members and allied officers stationed at Fort Benning. This rental housing, however, is controlled by the government because it is on leased government land.

Mobile Homes -- Fort Benning does not have a mobile home park.

# **Reporting Requirements**

Army regulation requires you to report to the Housing Services Office before you make any permanent on or off-post living arrangements. If you are eligible, you can be placed on the waiting list for on-post housing. All service members with families are members are eligible for on-post housing.

# **Permissive TDY (PTDY)**

If authorized 10-days PTDY for house hunting by an LTC or higher at your losing installation, report to the HSO Office at the beginning of PTDY failure to do could result in your being charged leave.

# **Temporary Lodging Facility**

Fort Benning Lodging has 688 affordable guest rooms offering various amenities. These facilities are available to all services, active and retired military, foreign officers, DOD Civilians and authorized guests. All guest rooms have security locking system, computer capabilities and laundry facilities are available.

# Availability

Very often, and especially during the summer months, on-post lodging is booked to capacity; however, <u>Columbus</u> offers a wide variety of temporary lodging choices. # **Installation Specific Information**

Installation Hospital

<u>Martin Army Community Hospital (MACH)</u>, Fort Benning, is a medical facility that provides an extensive variety of inpatient medical services to eligible military beneficiaries. The Emergency Room offers the latest in state of the art



technology to preserve life and provides efficient care. This 250-bed facility, conveniently located off I-185 on Marne Road, across from the Main Commissary-PX Mall, is the center for medical services at Fort Benning. Opened in 1958, it is one of the largest and most comprehensive community hospitals in the Army. Within the hospital's 9 floors, four of which are patient wards, an extensive surgical suite with same-day capabilities, labor- delivery and recovery suite, and over 36 ambulatory

care clinics. Martin Army Community Hospital maintains a fully accredited laboratory service, diagnostic radiology with computerized tomography and nuclear medicine, an extensive pharmacy service, and many other ancillary support services. In addition to its medical mission, the MEDDAC has an extensive professional teaching/training mission, and in 1972 established the Army's first Family Practice Residency Program. This 3-year program maintains approximately 30residents who provide medical services throughout the hospital. Other specialty training programs include the clinical portion of the Army's Physician Assistant Program, a residency in Health Care Administration, Podiatric Surgery internship, training in several enlisted specialties, and numerous clinical rotations or externships conducted in cooperation with local colleges and universities.

The MEDDAC is responsible for the operation of several services outside the hospital. Those located in Soldiers' Plaza include Social Work Service, and the Preventive Medicine Service, which includes Community Health Nursing, Occupational Health, the Preventive Medicine Clinic, and the Health Screening Center.

MACH offers a central appointment system where patients can obtain an appointment by calling 706-544-2273. No walk in care or "space A" care is available. True emergencies are seen in the ER. You can also make appointments online.

#### **Dental**

The Fort Benning Dental Activity (DENTAC) is a subordinate command of the South East Regional Dental Command (SERDC), located at Ft. Gordon, Georgia, and of the US Army Dental Command (DENCOM), located at Ft. Sam Houston, Texas.

The Ft. Benning DENTAC is responsible for the treatment and maintenance of the oral and dental health of all Soldiers assigned to Fort Benning, and Soldiers assigned to Ft. Rucker, Alabama. Maximizing dental readiness that supports the timely mobilization and deployment of Ft. Benning Divisional and tenant units, and tenant units at Ft Rucker, Alabama, is our mission and reason for existence. The Ft. Benning DENTAC is also responsible to provide dental support to the CRC (CONUS Replacement Center) for personnel (active duty and Reserve Component military member, and civilians, both GS and contractors) preparing for deployment and the demobilization of redeploying Soldiers.

The Ft. Benning DENTAC conducts the Advanced Education in General Dentistry-12 Month residency program for newly graduated dentists. This additional training prepares them to perform the full scope of comprehensive dentistry required in remote or isolated sites where US Army Soldiers live and work.

The Ft. Benning DENTAC consists of a Headquarters element, four local dental clinics, an in processing area co-located in 30th AG on Sand Hill, an In Processing section at Soldier's Plaza, and a subordinate Dental Clinic Command located at Ft. Rucker, Alabama.

After hours emergency dental patients should either report to the MACH Emergency Room or call the ER at 706-544-1502. (Examples of true dental emergencies include: jaw fracture, lacerations, knocked out teeth, severely fractured or displaced teeth, oral swelling that interferes with breathing, fever >101 degrees F from oral infection, uncontrollable hemorrhage, or severe acute toothache pain not controlled by medication.)

DENTAC policy requires that any female seeking after-hours emergency care must have an escort with them at all times.

Family members should seek emergency care from their TRICARE Dental Plan personal dentist. The list of participating dentists in the area is available at all dental facilities. Retirees should seek emergency care from the TRICARE Retiree Dental Plan personal dentist. More information on the US Army Ft. Benning DENTAC can be found at our web page.

# Health Care - Special Needs

# **Exceptional Family Member Program**

The Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) is mandatory for all Family Members who have been identified with a special medical or educational need. Enrolling in the EFMP ensures that the family member's medical needs will be considered during the assignment coordination process.

The Exceptional Family Member Program works in concert with other military and civilian agencies to provide a comprehensive and multidisciplinary approach for Families with special needs. The EFMP is regulated by AR 608-75 /AR 608-1 and supports family members who have physical, emotional or intellectual disabilities which require special treatment, therapy or counseling.

#### Services include:

- Information and referral about available services in the surrounding Fort Benning community and other installations
- Advocacy
- Support group information
- Recreational/cultural program information for children with disabilities
- Respite care
- Resource library
- Referral to other military/civilian agencies

# Eligibility

All active duty and retired military and their families, U.S. Army Reserve (USAR) and Active Guard Reserve (AGR). All of the above must be in possession of a valid ID card.

#### EFMP Enrollment Procedure

To enroll in the Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP), the Soldier contacts the nearest medical treatment facility EFMP point of contact to begin the assessment process and obtain enrollment forms. Once the forms are completed, they are forwarded to the appropriate regional center for coding and on to Army personnel agencies that enroll the soldier in the program. # Child Care Registration



All children and youth must be registered with Child, School and Youth Services before participating in programs and activities.

Child Care Centers/Programs Offered

Full-Day Care Centers -- Main Post CDC, Tot town CDC, and Sante Fe CDC. Full-day Care is designed for parents who need childcare services for their children on a regular basis. Full-day Care for ages 6wks-5yrs.

Part Day Preschool -- Benning Preschool for 3 and 4 year old children. Benning Buddies for two, three and four year olds.

Hourly Care -- Care provided on an irregular (drop-in) basis. Reservations are needed to ensure a space for the needed date and time. Hourly care is available at Tot Town CDC and School Age Services.

# **School Age Program**

This program offers supervised daily activities for children K-5th grade before and after regular school hours. Care is also provided during school holidays and summer .Middle School and Teens -- Provides open recreation facilities, teen activities, middle school program (6th-8th grade),and teen program (9th-12th grade).



# **Family Child Care Homes**

Child care is provided by a certified adult family member occupying government quarters. Parents interview, select and enter a contract with the provider. Certified homes are monitored for health, safety, and quality of service.

#### **Youth Services**



The Youth Center's goal is to provide a safe, healthy environment with programs that promote the well-being of youth. We strive to assist the youth in acquiring the knowledge, skills and character that will enable them to become independent, productive, and contributing members of society. We enable service men and women, and civilians to focus on the Military Mission by providing programs and services that create a sense of family and well-

being. Youth must be in grades 6th thru 12th & registered in CYSS through the Central Registration Office or the Middle School & Teen Program. Youth Center members must be prepared to sign-in and sign-out and present their CYSS ID cards in order to access the Middle School & Teen Center, check out game equipment, and participate in special activities (field trips, dances). Youth members also have access to a lounge area, open recreation activities, sports, arts and crafts, community services projects, homework center and technology lab. Programs are centered on the Army's four core service areas:

- Life Skills, Citizenship, and Leadership Opportunities
- Arts, Recreation and Leisure Activities
- Sports, Fitness and Health Options
- Academic Support, Mentoring & Intervention baseline programs

Youth Services is an affiliate member of Boys and Girls Clubs of America. We also offer 4-H Programs. Parent volunteer opportunities are available and encouraged in all areas of programming. The EDGE program offers out-of-school enrichment opportunities for children and youth (grades 1-12) to experience, develop, grow, and excel by participating in cutting-edge art, fitness, life skills and adventure activities, known as Art EDGE!, Fit EDGE!, Life EDGE! and Adventure EDGE!

Art EDGE! Promotes learning-by-doing and focuses on the development of lifetime skills through exposure to the arts. Art EDGE! Activities increase creative development while building self-esteem.

Fit EDGE! Educates and encourages children and youth to incorporate a healthier lifestyle through physical activity and nutritional awareness programs. Life EDGE! Imparts upon children and youth the skills needed for life-long growth as well as the exploration of future career fields.

Adventure EDGE! Encourages children and youth to embrace the outdoors and nature while being exposed to activities that stimulate relaxation.

The EDGE! Framework provides the Army's Child, Youth & School Services extracurricular enrichment options in Family and MWR program settings for youth of military and DoD civilians.

# **New Parent Support Program**



Because raising children can be a consuming task, it is understandable that many parents, especially new parents, feel overwhelmed. Playgroups provide social interaction, emotional support, and an opportunity to hear that other parents struggle with similar issues. Playgroups allow children an opportunity to make new friends, share

experiences, gain confidence, and develop both social and communication skills.

The New Parent Support Playgroup is opened to children between birth and three years of age

The Army New Parent Support Program (NPSP) provides intensive home visiting services to eligible Families with children prenatal to 3 years old whether they live on or off the installation. Activities and services provided include information and referral to military and civilian programs that support parents of infants and young children, such as parenting programs, respite care for children, and supervised play time for children. All activities and services provided through NPSP are voluntary and non-stigmatizing and emphasize the parents' strengths.

# Goals of the Army NPSP are:

- 1. Contribute to mission readiness.
- 2. Support Family member adaptation to military life.
- 3. Enhance the knowledge and skills Family members need to form healthy relationships and provide safe, nurturing environments for children to prevent Family violence.
- 4. Foster a supportive military community for young military Families.

#### **Staff Qualifications**

NPSP Home Visitor staff consists of Licensed Clinical Social Workers and Registered Nurses. All personnel will possess the knowledge, skills, and abilities necessary for their professional certification/licensure and positions. Local installation or State background checks, including Army Central Registry checks, will be completed on all personnel who provide services to parents and their children and will be updated annually.

# **Eligibility Requirements**

Families may be self-referred or referred by other agencies such as health care providers, chaplains, social service staff, command, or Family Advocacy Program (FAP) staff.

#### **How to Enroll**

Interested families may contact the local Army Community Service (ACS) office, or their health care provider, for further information in the New Parent Support Program.

Family Center

#### **Programs and Services**

A key resource on your installation and a gateway to accessing all of the resources available to you, the Army Community Services provides information, support and services to help you balance the demands of family and the military lifestyle. The Army Community Services is one part of the overall installation family support system, which is the network of agencies, programs, services, partnerships and individuals that supports your personal and family life

readiness, mobilization and deployment readiness, and mobility and economic readiness. The Army Community Services should be one of you first stops upon arriving at an installation; its programs and services will be an important resource for you and your family.

Deployment Readiness -- Assists you during all phases of the deployment cycle. We provide programs and services to individual soldiers, civilians, and family members throughout the deployment process. We educate you on what to expect and the best ways to prepare.

Relocation Readiness -- Provides information, referral, resources and tools to

help you with permanent change of station (PCS) moves and post-move orientations. We maintain a loan closet from which families may borrow basic household goods. We also assist you with in-transit emergencies by providing classes on move-related topics such as buying or selling homes and individual PCS planning, among others. We serve as liaison to citizenship, immigration, and multicultural diversity information, and provide outreach to waiting families.



Personal Financial Readiness -- A program to assist you in sustaining financial self-sufficiency. You can learn more about debt liquidation, thrift savings plans, consumer and credit issues, and predatory lending.

Employment Readiness -- The training and information provided can help you identify and reach your employment and career development goals, manage the challenges associated with a mobile lifestyle and develop job search skills. Assists you in acquiring skills, networks, and resources that will allow you to participate in the work force and to develop a career/work plan.

Family Life Education -- Provides you with information and education about a variety of life cycle issues, including parenting and relationships, among others, to help you strengthen your relationships.

Information and Referral -- An integral function of the family center, information and referral services can assist you in locating needed services and programs available on your installation, through civilian agencies in the local community, and connect to national resources.

Army Community Services may also provide other services, such as counseling, family advocacy, fitness and recreation programs and Exceptional Family Member support. Services vary by location.

The majority of employment opportunities available to Fort Benning family members can be found on Fort Benning, Columbus, GA and in several Alabama towns: Phenix City in Russell County and Smiths Station. Opelika and Auburn in Lee County. All the Alabama cities are located just across the Chattahoochee River that separate Georgia and Alabama and are approximately 20-30 minutes from the installation. Prospects are poor for employment in Social Services or in Management. Family members stationed at Fort Benning find employment with national and local no-fee employment agencies.

# **Spouse Career Advancement Initiative**

The Military Spouse Career Advancement Initiative is designed to advance military spouses into portable careers by providing them with education and training in high-growth, high-demand occupations. Career Advancement Accounts, also known as CAAs, are flexible education funding accounts to pay for expenses directly related to post-secondary education and training, including

tuition, fees, books, equipment, and credentialing and licensing fees necessary for portable careers. High-growth industries include financial services, education, healthcare, information technology and construction. High-demand occupations can be found in human resources, hospitality, homeland security and business administration. The Department of Labor (DOL) and the Department of Defense (DoD) are jointly funding this demonstration in eight states (California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Maine, North Carolina,



and Washington) targeting 18 military installations. Voluntary Education Centers and One-Stop Career Centers are collaboratively providing career counseling, guidance and assessments to support military spouse career and education choices. CAAs, are self-managed accounts that must be used with approved local education and training institutions. CAA funds must be used for expenses directly related to career preparation. There is a limited amount of funds available in the CAA

demonstration. The maximum amount of the CAA demonstration is \$6,000 for 24 months. Call Military OneSource at 1- 800-342-9647 or visit <u>milspouse</u> for more information.

# Military Spouse Career Advancement Account Program (MSCAAP)

The MSCAAP is a new financial aid program beginning April 2009. This program provides resources and assistance to spouses of active duty service members, Guard and Reserve (one year orders) supporting their pursuit of a successful, long-term, and portable career. The Military Spouse will be eligible to receive up to \$6,000 for certifications, licensures, GED, or college courses and must call the Military OneSource Center at 1-800-342-9647 and speak with a Career and Education Consultant. # **Programs and Services**



The Army Community Services (ACS) Relocation Readiness Program offers comprehensive programs and services to Soldiers and Families arriving at Fort Benning.

Lending Closet -- The lending closet provides basic housekeeping items for temporary loan to incoming and outgoing families and in other cases determined appropriate. Items include basic kitchen equipment, high chairs, car seats, pac-n-plays ironing boards, irons. Initially the items are

loaned out for 30 days, if additional time is required due to delays in household deliveries; requests for extensions are granted in 2 week increments. Orders to Fort Benning with assigned Unit POC and an ID cards required to check items out.

Newcomers Orientation/ -- Did you know that Columbus was a Navy town before it was an Army town? How about that, the Mother of the Blues, Ma Rainey lived in Columbus with her family? Or, that President Dwight D Eisenhower was stationed at Fort Benning during his distinguished military career? These are just a few of the little known facts about the Fort Benning and Columbus area, that we'll hear about when you attend Newcomers Orientation. The Newcomers is held every Wednesday morning and is part of the inprocessing. We highly encourage Spouses to attend this informative program.

The Utility Coordination Center provides courteous phone to contact area utility companies to initiate service. Deposit requirements are decided by the utility companies and it is based on personal credit history.

Relocation Counseling -- Relocation counseling is provided on an individual or group basis. It is available to both inbound and outbound personnel and with primary focus on pre-departure counseling and relocation planning. Personnel preparing for their first permanent change of station (PCS) move or first overseas PCS.

Sponsorship Training -- Training for unit sponsorship trainers or designated sponsors upon unit requests. The Relocation Program partners with CYS and other organizations on Fort Benning to provide training for youth sponsors. Providing a welcome packet for sponsor to send before personnel arrival.

Citizenship Study Group -- This Study Group is provided in an informal setting, offers information on U.S. government structure and history needed for the citizenship test, United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS)

interview and American Customs for Spouses and Family Members. This class also refers students to Citizenship counseling if they need help with United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) forms or information for obtaining U.S. Citizenship. In order to maximize the understanding of USCIS test and interview a strong-to-intermediate comprehension of English is required. ESL information will be given to students.

# Loan Closet

#### Items Available

The lending closet provides basic housekeeping items for temporary loan to incoming and outgoing families and in other cases determined appropriate. Items include basic kitchen equipment, high chairs, car seats, pack-n-plays ironing boards, irons.

#### Financial Assistance

# **Financial Readiness Program**

ACS, Financial Readiness Program, Soldiers' Plaza, Bldg 2624, 706-545-4043/5516, offers classes on: Military Pay, Checking Account Management, Budgeting, Debt Liquidation, and Financial Planning for Permanent Change of Station (PCS), and Deployment and Transition. The installation Financial Readiness Program provides consumer information, education, consumer complaint resolution assistance, financial information, and financial education. The program can help soldiers and families identify the most consumer-friendly businesses and institutions. Individual assistance is available for all aspects of consumer affairs, financial management, credit management, and credit/debt counseling.

# Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance (FSSA)

This program provides money to bring military households above 130% of the poverty level, and it is designed to keep soldiers, sailors, airmen and marines from having to use food stamps. Household size and household income are the two factors that determine eligibility for the FSSA Program and the amount of the FSSA allowance. ### **Army Emergency Relief**

AER is a private nonprofit organization incorporated in 1942 by the Secretary of War and the Army Chief of Staff. AER's sole mission is to help soldiers and their

dependents. The Army Emergency Relief Program provides emergency assistance to soldiers and their families in time of distress. AER provides: Help with emergency financial needs for:

- Food, rent or utilities
- Emergency transportation and vehicle repair
- Funeral expenses
- Medical/dental expenses
- Personal needs when pay is delayed or stolen
- Give undergraduate-level education scholarships, based primarily on financial need, to children of soldiers

AER does not provide funds:

- For nonessentials
- To finance ordinary leave or vacation
- To pay fines or legal expenses
- To liquidate or consolidate debt
- For purchase of home or home improvements
- To purchase, rent or lease vehicle
- To cover bad checks or pay credit card bills

#### **American Red Cross**

# **Legal Services**

Legal Assistance Division (LAD) provides advice and assistance to eligible clients on personal legal matters. Eligible clients include soldiers, retirees, and their family members (military ID card holders).

- Real property
- Consumer protection

Consultation with an attorney requires an appointment. Appointments are made up to one week in advance, beginning each Friday at 8:30am.

# Car Registration Services

Notarizations are performed and power of attorney and ad valorem forms are prepared on a walk-in basis. Ad valorem forms allow Soldiers and Family Members to register their cars in Georgia and Alabama without having to pay the Georgia personal property tax. Registrants must provide a LES no older than 90 days showing a state of residence other than Georgia, the VIN# number of the vehicle, and Military ID card.

#### Tax Services

Free advice and assistance in preparing federal and state taxes, as well as electronic filing of qualified returns, are offered through the LAD at the Installation Tax Center. The Tax Center operates from mid-January through mid-April. Clients are seen on a walk-in basis only (no appointments).

#### Claims Services

Claims Division provides assistance to soldiers and their families in filing claims for damages to household goods in association with a military move and to any individual who believes they have suffered damage or injury as a result of their government service or government negligence. Service is provided to customers on a walk-in basis.
